Three Tenets:

- Rapport Get to know each student on a personal level to determine the methods that best meet their learning style
- Respect Value students writing and will never take their voice away
- Relationship Good writing is hard work, and it takes time. WSIP expects to see students more than just once a semester for a quick fix.

What does WSIP offer?

- Tutoring
 - Individual, by appt
 - Walk-in
 - Small group, by appt
- Workshops
- Writing institutes
- Editing
- Job market preparation
- In-house library
- All of these are supported by professional writing support, individualized attention, instruction, mentoring, guidance and assistance

Tutoring by appt - students can go to website and register there

- Free for UA students, one 50 minute session every other week, can do online or in person
- Online appts use zoom and google docs
- Can purchase additional appts if needed
- Professional writing support: brainstorming, organization, clarit, developing content, fluency, grammar and style

Walk-in Tutoring

- Mondays 3-5 and Fridays 2-4
- No appt needed, no charge
- 15-20 minute sessions available
- Professional writing support: Paragraphs, short writing assignments, specific patterns

 Walk-ins are like triage tutoring, about looking at paragraphs, short writing assignments, and specific writing patterns to fix

Small group tutoring

- 3-4 students in a student group, 2 hour session every other week
- Free for UA Students
- These groups are graduate writing groups currently, but can be for undergraduates
- Can be from same/different majors, students can meet without a tutor any time
- Face to face or online through zoom, skype, etc.

Writing workshops

- Free and open to the public
- First one is Jan 23rd
- Weekly, 50 minute workshops
- Register in advance, Geronimo Bldg room 216
- Topics vary (see presentation and website)
