- Advising Application
 - A mobile app that is integrated with catcloud for them to complete a variety of tasks across campus.
 - Also collaborating with the Trellis Team
 - Students will earn points for completing tasks (i.e. enrolling in classes during priority registration, think tank, workshops, etc.)
 - Students will earn scholarships or meaningful prizes (i.e. cap/gown for seniors).
 - Focus group for the Spring 2023 semester to determine what students need and want for the reward structure.

- FERPA 101 online training
- Education records include any information or data recorded (i.e. grades, SID, Financial Aid, courses completed/taken, etc).
- Authorization for Release of Information
 - Takes about 1-2 business days to be posted on students' account once the Registrar's office has received it.
 - Can see who is authorized and timeline on UAccess by clicking on the "star indicator" → click on CIR link and it will provide all information regarding the release of information.
 - Long term use is maximum of 5 years.
 - When students send the form via email from their official UA email address, a signature is not required as verification is through their email.
 - If a student is under the age of 18 years parent affidavit form is required (student does not need to request, it)
 - In the future, PDF forms will be changing to an online digital form to request their information of release.
 - Verbal approval from the student is sufficient to release information during advising appointments – best practice for students to still complete the release form.
 - If sensitive information was released on accident please contact the Office of the Registrar to investigate.
 - Advisors are not required to share information if subpoenaed, must be redirected to the Office of General Counsel.

- Sharing student information with instructors
 - Be mindful of what information you are sharing with instructors and if it is applicable.
 - Do not gossip or share information that does not impact the course/instructor knowledge.
 - Use your best professional judgement.
- Directory Information
 - Directory information can be released without an information release on file.
 - Students can restrict directory information; you can view this in the bio/demo data on UAccess.
- Best practices for virtual advising!
 - Be in a private space, use headphones and use approved secure tools (D2L/Box/Zoom).
