- Next application deadline is January 1st 2020 (leave in August or September)
- Know by March if accepted (9 month process of application to when you leave)
- Safety and Health: Medical officers available 24/7
- Benefits: Living stipend, housing, travel to and from, medical and dental coverage, paid vacation, defer student loans and career skills and training
- After service: Transition funds of approx. \$8,000, grad school benefits, networking, fed employment advantage, public service loan forgiveness, access to affordable health ins.
- Can apply generally or to a specific position
- Apply early! Meet with the recruiter and tailor your resume

- Peace Corps Prep has coursework, they will follow up to see if it can count in a thematic minor, stay tuned.

- Blocked from enrolling in a course for a 4th attempt:
- Here is the process: Student initiates request at Math webpage. Online form, need help button in green. Course Repeat Exception Request. They need to fill in the form with thoughtful answers.
- Student then meets with their Academic Advisor and fills in the form
- Student returns form to Math Dept. receives student success tips handout
- Math submits request to GSA
- Student enrolls in class after GSA approves request.
- GSA processes these 2 weeks before the term
- This process starts in Spring 2020
