

New Workshops Fall 2020

Writing assignments are essential elements of curricula in all subject areas. In online classes, they are a key means for students to document and illustrate understanding of content, as well as to communicate with classmates and instructors. Through discussion posts, short answers, and essay assignments, student can build ideas about topics, expand understanding, and share what they've learned. However, online writing assignments can also be challenging, for teachers and students alike. How do you scaffold assignments to help students strengthen writing over a semester? How can you create assignments that are meaningful, but don't create an overwhelming amount of writing to grade? How do you balance content knowledge and presentation in grading? How do you avoid writing in isolation? How do you conquer writer's anxiety? How do you write effectively when you don't consider yourself a strong writer? Our new workshops will address these questions for writers and teachers in online classrooms.
